1 Apologies

There were no apologies for absence.

2 Code of Conduct

Councillor Parkin declared that he had been lobbied about Agenda Item 9. Councillor Duncombe made a Declaration of Pecuniary Interest in Agenda Item 16.

- I. Streetlights with electrical faults that cannot be quickly repaired 48 Eastgate (out for just over a year) and Stone Garth. Our electrical contractor (Acorn) cannot work on NEDL property. NYCC Streetlighting will try to get NEDL to attend asap. Complaints received about both.
- II. Complaint about streetlights on Elmslac Road brightness and on at night (email circulated).
- III. Complaint received about faint 'No Parking' markings on Buckingham square; referred to NYCC.
- IV. Complaint reiterated about the volume of water on Pottergate by the dropped kerb. Referred to the head of NYCC Highways, Richard Marr.
- V. The council has been thanked for the work on the lime trees by Church Street.

- VI. The Feversham Monument was damaged by the placing of a cone on the Earl's head a finial was knocked off. The damage was reported to the police.

12 Planning Applications and Tree Protection Order: The council considered the following:

- a) Application No. 14/00839/HOUSE Applicant Miss Sandra Race Proposal Erection of external flue to gable end.
 Address 8 Storey Close, Helmsley YO62 5DP Decision: No comment.
- b) Application No. 14/01122/HOUSE Applicant Mr N Jones Proposal Replacement of front door and replacement of existing UPVC front windows with a mixture of vertical and horizontal sliding sash double glazed timber windows together with erection of front stone wall piers with stone coping and wrought iron railings and erection of rear single storey extension. Address 1 Pottergate, Helmsley, YO62 5BU Decision Whilst welcoming the transition to wooden windows the town council has a concern that the proposed railings and stone piers are out of keeping with the property and will exaggerate an already unusual and prominent feature of the front elevation.
- c) Application No. NYM/2014/0660/FL amended Applicant Mr Michael Metcalfe Proposal Construction of 1no. dwelling and attached garage. Address Land off Carlton Road, Helmsley. Decision The Town Council deplores the proposal to remove the old forge. Access to the garage proposed would be better made from 'Linkfoot Close' which the developers are happy to accommodate. The current proposal for the driveway exacerbates the already difficult road junction less than 10 metres away and it suggests that the west aspect of the site will be developed at some future date.
- d) Application No. NYM/2014/0718/FL Applicant Mr Howard Topham
 Proposal Construction of replacement conservatory to rear together with re-roofing works.
 Address 3 High Street, Helmsley Decision No comment.

e) Application No. 14/00898/TPO Applicant Mr N Rhodes

Address 38 The Limes, Helmsley, YO62 5DT **Decision** No comment. **Proposal Tree 1** (sited next to boundary line) Crown lift to 6 metres. North side: Removal of 1 branch with 12cm diameter. East side: Removal of 2 branches with 12-15cm diameter. South side: Removal of 1 branch with 10-12 cam diameter. Removal of 1 small branch less than 5 cm diameter. West side: Removal of 1 branch with 15cm diameter.

Tree 2 (sited in centre of garden). Crown lift to 6 metres. North side: Removal of 1 branch with diameter of 12cm. Removal of 1 small branch less than 5 cm diameter. East side: Removal of 1 branch with 8cn diameter. South side: Removal of 1 branch with 18-20cm diameter with inclusion at branch union. West side: Removal of 2 smaller branches with 5-8cm diameter.

13 Churchyard/ Cemetery

The council welcomed the responses which it had received as a result of the Autumn newsletter. The church has agreed to establish a modest wildflower area. The council may apply for funding from the NYMNPA for conservation work in 2015 in the cemetery and the extent of work will be decided then. A hedge-laying course run by RDC is to be arranged.

14 Cemetery

- a) The Council resolved to adopt the revised Cemetery Rules and resolved that one additional plot may be reserved at the time of interment.
- **b)** The council discussed having sheep in the cemetery but the presence of yew trees was a problem as they are poisonous to sheep.
- c) The council agreed the Cemetery Fees from the 1 January 2015.

15 NYCC Library Consultation

The Council resolved to respond to the NYCC Library Consultation in January. The council urged individuals to make their own feelings known. Consultation deadline 8th February 2015.

16 Verges

a) The Council noted the reduction in funding for verge cutting from NYCC from 1 April 2015 (actual funding 2014-2015 was £1587.06). Details and map circulated.

- b) The council received NYCC's map showing who is responsible for which verges in Helmsley. The council resolved not to make representations about where a visibility cut is required other than those shown. Councillor Parkin will talk to the residents of Swanland Road & Ryedale Close to gauge the level of support or opposition to the proposed change of cutting policy there in order to create a meadow.
- c) The council discussed the council's policy of looking after verges which are not the responsibility of NYCC and for which either an owner or responsible authority has or has not been identified. The council resolved not to cut land for which the owner is unknown/known except for the grass around the trees by High Street. In future the Town Caretaker will trim the grass behind Town Hall because this forms part of Helmsley's "heritage view".
- d) The Council will determine specifications for the tenders for verge cutting at its December meeting. Councillors Parkin, Swift and Marsden will work on the tender document. Yorkshire Housing to be asked about having one grass cutting contract with the council. Ryedale District Council to be asked if they would like the council to continue cutting their grass and if so, would they like to make a contribution to the cost.

17 Meetings

19 Helmsley Town Council and Helmsley Recreation Charity, Reg'd No. 523358

The Council resolved to agree the following matters, subject to agreement at a Helmsley Recreation Charity Meeting. That Helmsley Town Council, as sole trustee:

- **a)** Conducts the weekly inspections of the Charity's Children's Play Area, arranges and pays for its Annual Inspection, and arranges and pays for maintenance and repairs.
- **b)** Arranges for the inspection of trees on the Charity's land and arranges and pays for any tree work required.

20 Finance and Governance

- **a)** The Council received the Annual Accounts of Helmsley Recreation Charity, Reg'd No. 523358.
- **b)** The Council agreed the winter services policy, as per RDC's Winter Maintenance rates.
- **c)** The Council agreed to give the clerk delegated approval to replace out of order streetlight bulbs with LED bulbs/lanterns where practicable.
- **d)** The Council resolved to ratify the clerk's decision to authorise expenditure on the following surveys by Elliott Consultancy Ltd:
 - trees within the recreation ground at a cost of £300.00 plus VAT on behalf of Helmsley Recreation Charity.
 - trees within the churchyard at a cost of £100.00 plus VAT.
 - Further investigative inspections of Trees 225, 281, 312 at a cost of £100.00 plus VAT.
- e) The council deferred consideration of the draft budget for 2015-2016.
- f) The Council resolved to authorise writing off the £10,000 loan to Helmsley Recreation Charity as follows: £5,000 on the 1st April 2015 and £5,000 on the 1st April 2016.
